9. Comments:

- Our county members received & read the MoneyWise newsletter.
- Due to elderly members who are already retired, many financial decisions are already made & being practiced.
- Most members are retired & have attended planning programs prior to their retirement.
- Club states that all members in their group are over age 70 and if financial planning hasn't been done by now-it's too late.
- They would like more issues on healthcare & Medicare plans, more about drug plans, more about keeping our homes safe, how we can keep and protect ourselves and how to arm ourselves.
- Several comments from counties stating "same questions are asked every year, but lessons do not correlate with these questions". Also, majority are in their 60's and above and requesting lesson topics such as identity fraud, scams protection and reverse mortgages.
