

Management and Safety Annual Report

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020

This has been an unusual year for KEHA. I am happy to report that all 14 areas are represented in this report. The 14 areas include 79 counties and 320 clubs.

Our members acted on the following areas related to management and safety:

- 2,120 members learned methods to manage their holiday expenses.
- 1,409 members learned how to maximize profits and savings at yard sales and consignment shops.
- 1,193 members implemented strategies to downsize their homes.
- 962 members utilized methods to evaluate health insurance needs and options.
- 529 members developed an estate plan for digital assets.
- 922 members gained knowledge regarding international travel planning.

Although programs were cancelled the latter part of the year there were many activities completed by the clubs. A summary of Management and Safety related activities included:

- Time Management mini lesson

- Handouts titled “Kentuckians Urged to Prepare for Emergencies”, “Holiday Budget Game Plan”, “Home Design to Help You Stay Safe”, “Who Will Protect Your Finances”, and “Striking a Balance to Avoid Dangerous Falls”
- Adhered to the danger and warnings of the COVID virus and encouraged all members to use sanitizers, face masks and social distancing
- Community Safety Day which included fire, vehicle, and financial safety, etc.

- Guest speaker who addressed Medicare and other health options and how to get the best plan
- Program on storm safety and developing a home safety and preparedness plan
- Cell phone usage while driving
- Coordinated a program with the local fire department to share information about home safety
- Face Masks were made to give to local community members
- Piggy Bank project presented to children 6 to 8 years of age
- Utilized the FCS You Tube lessons
- Read articles about safety and management online
