Kentucky Counts! 2020 Census Quilt Project

The Kentucky Extension Homemakers Association is partnering with the U.S. Census Bureau to create a unique quilt featuring **one square** from each of Kentucky's 120 counties. This special quilt will travel statewide, demonstrating that each county matters, and reminding viewers that every person must be counted for Kentucky to have appropriate congressional representation and federal funding.

KEHA is spearheading the construction of this special quilt, with area and county presidents asked to provide leadership in promoting the project. Each county is asked to prepare and submit <u>one</u> quilt square based on these specifications.

- 6 1/2" block (6" square when finished).
- 100% cotton fabrics (pre-washing recommended).
- White background.
- Recommended design colors are yellows, blues and/or greens.
- Each county selects the pattern or design.
- The design should emphasize unique characteristics of the county.

The following information should be typed or legibly written on a sheet of paper and mailed with the quilt block:

- Name, address and phone number of the quilter
- Name of county
- Brief description of the quilt square design including any historical notes
