Breckenridge County Extension Homemakers 2019-2020

- The Breckinridge County Homemaker Clubs and Mailbox members have reported making 5,785 face coverings during the Covid-19 Pandemic.
- By providing sewing machines, material and notions, the Breckinridge County Homemaker Council and membership supported Breckinridge County Detention Center/SAP program in the construction of 1,000 face coverings that were used in the facility and distributed to the community through the Health Department.



- The Cloverport Homemakers Club partnered with the Cloverport Schools and other community members to
 make over 1,800 face coverings so that each student and staff member will have multiple face coverings to
 use while at school.
- The Breckinridge County Homemakers altered over 100 masks for the local hospital so that the healthcare providers could use them in a more safe and efficient way.

Cultural Arts— Craft classes. 1 or more each month. These events were great for gaining new members. Most of the 24 new members that year were gained through this project. Each participant would pay a fee for the craft, with the materials and a class taught.

Washington County Homemaker Year 2019-2020

Washington County Homemakers participated in the Truth and Consequences program, which takes high school freshmen through various true-to-life scenarios that could happen during their lifetimes and shows them the possible consequences of their action.

- They had a baked goods booth at the Downtown Crafter's Market in November.
- Homemakers donated 520 oz. of beef stew for the Food Distribution Project.
- 11 capes were constructed and donated to the Center for Courageous Kids.
- The activities for our 25th annual Child Abuse Prevention Campaign were curtailed by Covid-19 restrictions, but proclamations were signed, blue bows were placed downtown, and the banner and pinwheel gardens were installed at the courthouse in Springfield.
- 81 masks were made and donated to Kentucky Children's Hospital.
